- 6 MR. GEISLER: Roll call for the regular
- 7 meeting held on September 19, 2016.
- 8 MR. PUZIO: Here.
- 9 MS. RIBAUDO: Here.
- MS. SUSINO: Here.
- MR. QUILES: Here.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Here.
- 13 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Here.
- 14 (All rise for the recitation of the Pledge of
- 15 Allegiance.)
- MR. GEISLER: Approval of the minutes from
- 17 the transcript of the caucus and regular meeting held
- on August 15, 2016. Is there a motion?
- 19 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Make the motion.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Second.
- 21 MR. PUZIO: I abstain. I wasn't here for
- 22 that meeting.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Here. Yes.
- 24 MS. SUSINO: I abstain. I wasn't here.
- MR. QUILES: Yes.

- 1 MS. BARCKETT: Absent.
- 2 MR. GIACOMARRO: Abstain. I wasn't here.
- 3 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Yes.
- 4 MR. DE MARCO: How many abstains do we have?
- 5 MR. GEISLER: Three abstains.
- 6 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Three and three.
- 7 MR. GEISLER: Okay. Roberts Rules. We're
- 8 all right.
- 9 Bills for payment, September 19th, 2016. For
- a total amount of \$170,556.86. Do we have a motion?
- 11 CHAIRMAN DABAL: I'll make it.
- MS. RIBAUDO: I'll second.
- MR. PUZIO: Yes.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Yes.
- MS. SUSINO: Yes.
- MR. QUILES: Yes.
- 17 MR. GIACOMARRO: I abstain. And I would like
- 18 to say something. I've been asking for almost a year
- 19 now --
- MR. GEISLER: And I give you the same answer
- 21 every time. You got to talk to him. You tell me
- 22 you're going to talk to him.
- 23 MR. GIACOMARRO: I don't talk to him. I
- don't work here.
- MR. GEISLER: You told me you were going to

- 1 call Bill Katchen.
- 2 MR. GIACOMARRO: I haven't spoken to him.
- 3 MR. GEISLER: And I told you the response was
- 4 that he's not changing his program for us. So if you
- 5 want us to get a new accountant, we'll get a new
- 6 accountant and get a new bill list. This is the answer
- 7 I got for you.
- 8 MR. GIACOMARRO: I didn't hear that.
- 9 MR. GEISLER: I told you this the last --
- 10 every time I tell you this.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I haven't been here for two
- months.
- MR. GEISLER: Well, when you were here, I
- 14 told you. Bill Katchen said this is all he's got.
- 15 He's got to change his whole program. You told me, I'm
- 16 going to call Bill.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I will. I really shouldn't,
- 18 because I don't get paid to work here, but I will call
- 19 him.
- MR. GEISLER: Well, you're the one that wants
- 21 it, so you should call him.
- 22 MR. GIACOMARRO: I never -- I can't imagine
- 23 giving away \$170,000 and not knowing what the hell I'm
- 24 giving it away for.
- MR. GEISLER: Ask me the question who it is.

- 1 MR. GIACOMARRO: Every one of them.
- 2 MR. GEISLER: Let's go. We'll do it
- 3 afterwards.
- 4 MR. GIACOMARRO: No.
- 5 MS. DAY: Give me the bill.
- 6 MR. GIACOMARRO: What do you want, Colleen,
- 7 you really want me to sit here and go over the bills?
- MS. DAY: If you have a question --
- 9 MR. GIACOMARRO: I don't get paid for that.
- 10 The board of education has three times or five times --
- MR. GEISLER: Listen to me. We're not the
- one that does it. This is the program that's done by
- 13 HUD and Bill Katchen.
- 14 MR. GIACOMARRO: I understand that.
- MS. DAY: The bills are right there in front
- 16 of you.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: We'll hold up the meeting
- while I go through every one of these bills?
- MS. RIBAUDO: If it makes you happy, yes.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I have a question on every
- 21 one of them.
- 22 MR. GEISLER: Okay. Then go ahead.
- MS. RIBAUDO: You have a right to do it.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: We'll hold up the meeting
- while I go through every one of these bills.

- 1 MR. GEISLER: If you have to go through every
- one, eventually you'll figure it out.
- 3 MR. GIACOMARRO: Mr. Chairman, tell me who
- 4 the hell is kidding me.
- 5 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Let's do it.
- 6 MR. GEISLER: Go through the bills, if you
- 7 want.
- 8 MR. GIACOMARRO: Your father would love this.
- 9 CHAIRMAN DABAL: He's watching. Don't worry.
- 10 MR. GIACOMARRO: Forget it. I'm just going
- 11 to vote no.
- 12 MR. GEISLER: Okay.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I can't understand how you
- 14 cannot put --
- 15 MS. RIBAUDO: Which one of them?
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Every damn one of them, Ro.
- 17 Ro --
- MS. RIBAUDO: Wait. Wait. Don't you yell at
- 19 me.
- 20 MR. GIACOMARRO: You were here before. Was
- 21 it like this before?
- 22 MS. RIBAUDO: Richie, stop. Yes.
- MR. GEISLER: Listen. I'm telling you, we'll
- 24 go over every one afterwards. I don't have a problem
- 25 with that.

- 1 MS. RIBAUDO: What don't you understand?
- 2 Which one don't you understand?
- 3 MR. GIACOMARRO: What are you saying?
- 4 MS. RIBAUDO: Dental.
- 5 MR. GIACOMARRO: Yes.
- 6 MS. RIBAUDO: Plumbing, heating.
- 7 MR. GIACOMARRO: For what?
- 8 MS. RIBAUDO: The housing authority.
- 9 MR. GIACOMARRO: Does it say that here? For
- 10 all I know, they went to Marty's house to fix a
- 11 plumbing thing.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Yeah, they probably --
- MR. GIACOMARRO: You know what I'm talking
- 14 about, Ro. For Christ's sake, you know what I'm
- 15 talking about.
- 16 CHAIRMAN DABAL: The backup is in there.
- MS. DAY: The backup is in there.
- 18 MR. GIACOMARRO: You really think I should go
- 19 through every one of those?
- MR. GEISLER: Do you need to go through every
- 21 one to figure it out?
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Why is it so hard to put
- plumbing on 377?
- MS. DAY: And you still won't know what it
- is, because you won't know what the explanation is.

- 1 You won't know it.
- 2 MR. GEISLER: Listen to me. What you need to
- 3 do, you have to call Bill and tell him he's got to get
- 4 a new program. If you don't get a new program, we have
- 5 to get a new fee accountant. That's all.
- 6 MS. RIBAUDO: If Bill don't want to do it, we
- 7 have to get somebody else.
- 8 MR. GEISLER: He doesn't want to do it. He
- 9 spent thousands of dollars on this program. Every one
- of his housing authorities have the same program.
- 11 MS. DAY: We have to use what he wants.
- MR. GEISLER: Every one has the same program.
- 13 He must have ten housing authorities.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I'll call him. It don't
- 15 matter.
- 16 MR. QUILES: Sir, can I interject for one
- 17 second?
- Mr. Giacomarro, when you were here two months
- 19 ago, you're right, you did bring it up. Two or three
- 20 months ago, when you first started, you did brought it
- 21 up. And it was the exact same comment that Mr. Geisler
- 22 gave you, sir. You said, yes, I'm going to see him
- 23 tonight on the board of -- tomorrow, I believe were
- 24 your words.
- I understand your frustrations, because I

- 1 went through this. I've been on this board 15 years.
- 2 I've been through this a few times also. If that's the
- 3 program that he has in place, then our only alternative
- 4 is to find someone else.
- 5 MR. GEISLER: That's what I said.
- 6 MR. QUILES: That's all we can do. When he
- 7 comes up for his contract, either he adapts to us or we
- 8 find someone else.
- 9 MR. GIACOMARRO: When does his contract
- 10 expire?
- MS. DAY: April 1st.
- MR. GEISLER: April 1st.
- MS. DAY: March 31st.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: So when I brought this up
- 15 eight, nine months ago, the old contract was there, and
- 16 we never brought it up when his new contract came.
- MR. QUILES: I don't think you've been here
- 18 that long.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Who?
- MR. QUILES: You, sir. I think you've only
- 21 been here like three or four months.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: No.
- MR. QUILES: When did you come up?
- MR. GIACOMARRO: December -- no, October.
- 25 CHAIRMAN DABAL: I think he was here to vote

- 1 on the contracts.
- 2 MR. QUILES: So you were fully aware of it
- 3 then?
- 4 MR. GIACOMARRO: Yeah, I've been bringing it
- 5 up every month since then.
- 6 MR. QUILES: But we voted it on. You voted
- 7 on --
- 8 MR. GIACOMARRO: I've been waiting for it to
- 9 get fixed.
- 10 MR. QUILES: You've known him for awhile. So
- 11 I would suggest, try it. Take him out to lunch and ask
- 12 him, why is this going on? Why can't I have a better
- answer for my questions?
- 14 MR. GIACOMARRO: Okay. Next.
- MS. DAY: The whole thing is, you'll still
- 16 have the question even if there's an explanation next
- 17 to it, because you say it's a water pump and you say,
- 18 well, for what or where?
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Colleen, you have an idea
- 20 what it is. Let me ask you a question. I mean, this
- is a stupid question, because I don't mean to --
- there's a check number 16985. Colleen Day.
- MS. DAY: I knew it. I called it.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Because that's the only one
- 25 I know.

- 1 MS. DAY: I called it. You don't know --
- 2 that's the only one you don't know?
- 3 MR. GIACOMARRO: Well, I didn't know -- I
- 4 know you didn't go to Atlantic City.
- 5 MS. LEHNING: Look at the invoice.
- MS. DAY: The bill's right there. Because I
- 7 had --
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Wonderful. But why doesn't
- 9 it say here --
- MS. DAY: Because I had --
- 11 MR. GEISLER: For Bingo supplies for seniors.
- MS. DAY: That's Cathy Kotwica.
- MR. GEISLER: Cathy Kotwica.
- MS. DAY: No, mine is there.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Because the people that play
- 16 Bingo --
- MS. DAY: No. That was Cathy Kotwica. Mine
- 18 was for a computer that we purchased for a tenant who
- 19 couldn't afford it and we're paying it back.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Hold on. I know you didn't
- 21 screw anything, but why isn't it on here?
- 22 MS. DAY: But just ask and we'll tell you.
- 23 It's not a big deal.
- MS. RIBAUDO: And they bought Bingo stuff for
- 25 people and had to pay back.

- 1 MS. DAY: The other one is Sal for
- 2 his eyeglasses.
- 3 MR. GIACOMARRO: I don't understand it.
- 4 MS. DAY: Pay attention to the bills. Look
- 5 at them. You'll know what they are. We pay the same
- 6 bills. How many bills -- do you not know? It's the
- 7 same bills every month. The same bills every month.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Why can't there be an
- 9 explanation?
- MS. DAY: So look at the bills and get
- 11 yourself familiar with them and you'll know what they
- 12 are. And if there is one, then you'll only have a
- 13 question on the one.
- 14 CHAIRMAN DABAL: I went through that in the
- 15 beginning too. So I came in and asked -- you know, I'd
- 16 circle which ones I had no idea what they were, and I
- 17 went in there and --
- 18 MR. GIACOMARRO: Let me ask you a question.
- 19 I said before, I'm on the board of education. We have
- 20 three times this many --
- 21 CHAIRMAN DABAL: Oh, I'm familiar with the
- 22 bills there.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Okay. What is the problem?
- 24 Why can't we do that?
- 25 CHAIRMAN DABAL: With a different accountant,

- 1 we can do that.
- 2 MR. GIACOMARRO: Well, if you tell your
- 3 accountant, you can do it.
- 4 CHAIRMAN DABAL: I think he refused to change
- 5 his program.
- 6 MR. GIACOMARRO: I don't believe that. I
- 7 know Bill too many years.
- 8 MR. QUILES: Mr. Giacomarro, that's exactly
- 9 the same answer Mr. Geisler gave you in reference to
- 10 Mr. Katchen. Mr. Katchen's reply was he's not going to
- 11 change the program for us when he has other authorities
- 12 that he deals with.
- MR. GEISLER: How much is it?
- MS. DAY: It's thousands of dollars. Then
- 15 he'd have to change them on every housing authority he
- 16 has --
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Why?
- MS. DAY: Because when he comes here, when he
- 19 goes to another housing authority, he knows the
- 20 program. It's not ten different programs he has to
- 21 deal with. That's exactly why it is.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: That's absolutely
- 23 ridiculous.
- MS. DAY: Well --
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Absolutely ridiculous.

- 1 MR. GEISLER: Listen, I would feel the same
- 2 way as you, for awhile I would feel the same way, until
- 3 I learned about -- I don't know anything about
- 4 computers, to tell you the truth.
- 5 MR. GIACOMARRO: Me either.
- 6 MR. GEISLER: Until we sat there and listened
- 7 and we went to go get our own computer program. And
- 8 they want 70,000, 60,000, 50,000. Because it's
- 9 tailor-made specifically for housing authority stuff.
- 10 So there's not many places that make them. There's
- only a half a dozen different dealers that do that.
- 12 There's no -- you can't just use any computer program.
- 13 They use the one for housing authorities.
- 14 MR. GIACOMARRO: We'll see. We'll see.
- MR. GEISLER: Well, I hope you get it.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: I'll find out one way or
- 17 another. Either Bill Katchen or HUD. One way or the
- 18 other.
- 19 MR. GEISLER: Yes, I hope you get it from
- 20 him. HUD's not going to know what kind of computer
- 21 program Bill Katchen uses.
- 22 MR. GIACOMARRO: You're telling me it's the
- 23 same one for the whole world.
- 24 MR. GEISLER: No. For his clients.
- MR. GIACOMARRO: Excuse me. Okay.

- 1 MR. GEISLER: His clients. Unless HUD is
- 2 familiar with his computer program, then they can help
- 3 you.
- 4 MR. GIACOMARRO: I have no idea. I don't
- 5 even know how to turn a computer on. I don't own one.
- 6 MR. GEISLER: This is why it's hard for you
- 7 to understand. It would be hard for me, because I
- 8 didn't understand it either. Until I figured out that
- 9 there's not many people that make these programs, only
- 10 a couple. And that's the way it works.
- 11 MR. GIACOMARRO: I'll find out.
- 12 MR. GEISLER: Okay. Resolution 2016-18. I
- don't even know what we're talking about because he's
- 14 got me in a tizzy here. Yes, we did the bills, right?
- 15 Yes.
- MS. RIBAUDO: Yes, we did the bills.
- 17 MR. GEISLER: He didn't vote.
- MS. DAY: Dabal is last.
- 19 CHAIRMAN DABAL: I have to abstain on certain
- 20 checks. Check number 3014, check number 3015, 3016,
- 21 3022 and 3023. Yes on the rest.
- 22 MR. GEISLER: New business. You want to do
- 23 it on here, Coll?
- MS. DAY: Yes.
- MR. GEISLER: Resolution 2016-18.

- 1 September -- Employment Practice Liability Program
- 2 Update. This requires members of the JIF to update
- 3 every two years to remain qualified for premium
- 4 incentives. Anybody want to sign this?
- 5 MR. QUILES: I'll do it.
- 6 MR. GEISLER: Go ahead.
- 7 And this is the one for the budget. If
- 8 anybody wants to sign the one for the budget, we'll get
- 9 that out of the way too.
